COVE MEETING MINUTES



The Construction Oversight and Value Engineering Committee (COVE) monthly meeting convened on Thursday, May 16, 2019 at 8:05 a.m., at Facilities Services, 6501 Magic Way, Bldg. 200, Orlando, Florida 32809.

COVE Members in Attendance: Ksenia Merck, Pat Knipe, James Knapp, Stuart Kramer, Mario Cuello, and Douglas Kelly.

OCPS Staff in Attendance: John Morris, Laura Kelly, Judith Padres, Dale Kelly, Basem Ghneim, Jeff Hart, Mark O'Connor, Mari Espinal, Rory Salimbene, Mike Winter, Linda Lindsey, Alva Johnson, Rocco Williams, Ganesh Jiawon, Toni Greene, Mariangeles Garcia and Sandra Roopwah (as scribe).

Call to Order:

A quorum was established and Chairman Ksenia Merck called the meeting to order at 8:05 a.m.

Approval of Minutes

The minutes from March 21, 2019 and April 18, 2019 were presented and approved by the committee with the following revisions:

Douglas Kelly requested the following revisions for March 21, 2019 minutes:

- On page one, replace "had" with "have to" in the last sentence.
- On page two, second paragraph under "M/WBE Update" change "Seminole County" to "Seminole State."
- On page three, under "Prototypes and Design Guidelines in the first paragraph, change "Presented" to "presented."
- On page four, first line in paragraph four, replace "to make" with "that," insert "be made" after presentation, and replace "that" with "who."
- On page five, last sentence under FCA update, replace "re-valuate" with "reevaluate."

Ksenia Merck requested clarification as to what constitutes a quorum because the COVE Charter states telephonic presence is acceptable. Laura Kelly explained that since COVE is a committee subject to the Sunshine Law, the requirements of the law override the provisions of the Charter. Since the Charter was adopted in 2002, there has been clarification from the Attorney General's Office that requires a member be physically present to constitute a quorum. Laura Kelly mentioned that she spoke with the General Counsel and he recommends that a committee be formed to review and recommend revisions to the Charter. Ksenia Merck asked the Committee members to review the Charter and advise of any issues that need to be address before it is amended. Pat Knipe requested a copy of the COVE Charter. A copy of the COVE Charter will be emailed to each member.

A copy of Ksenia Merck's notes from the Facilities Board Workshop was distributed and added to the April COVE minutes for inclusion.

Jeff Hart indicated for April 18, 2019 minutes, under "Project Status" the "s" from "Water Springs" needs to be deleted.

The minutes were approved with the above edits.

Departmental Reports

> Finance Report

Judith Padres stated that there have been no changes to the budget this month. She indicated that the category titled "Other Funds" from her report was missing and it will be sent via email.

Judith Padres gave two cash flow handouts to the Committee that replaced pages 12 and 13 of her report. The handouts addressed the cash flow based on whether Facilities proceeded with addressing priorities 1-3 or priorities 1-5 as identified in the Facilities Condition Assessment.

Stuart Kramer asked if the \$24 million "Estimated Revenues" is for FY19. Judith Padres explained that it is the projected collection from now through June 30, 2019.

Douglas Kelly asked what "Functional Equity" is. Jeff Hart explained that it is a program designed to assess whether additional facilities are warranted based on an existing school's permanent student stations and square feet versus that of the respective prototype's permanent student stations and square feet, along with the projected student enrollment.

Stuart Kramer asked if there is anticipated to be an increase in impact fees. Dale Kelly stated that there is no anticipated increase in impact fees reflected in the budget; however, the impact fee revenue is difficult to predict because it is based on the current economy and housing market.

Judith Padres provided a follow-up regarding Capital Renewal Cash Flow.

Dale Kelly provided an update on sales tax projections and highlighted that the funds collected last month were \$21.5 million. To date the District is over budget by 5.99 percent.

Project Status

Mark O'Connor conveyed that there are no significant changes to the budget to report this month.

Jeff Hart reported that there are currently 13 projects under construction amounting

to approximately \$316 million. He briefed the Committee on projects under construction, substantial completions, anticipated future milestones, projects in closeout and those in the design phase. He also presented various photos of the Pine Hills Transportation Compound.

Pat Knipe inquired about the definition of a CFI. Jeff Hart explained it is the abbreviation for Certificate of Final Inspection.

Toni Greene asked the Committee to consider moving the August 15, 2019 meeting to August 8, 2019, for the annual bus tour of a new school since school reopens on August 12, 2019.

Mario Cuello asked if there are cameras on the school buses currently being used. Jeff Hart responded in the affirmative.

Capital Renewal Update

Rory Salimbene noted that there are currently 53 active projects in progress for improvements at 44 sites with an estimated total cost of \$204.5 million and construction cost of approximately \$157 million. The active projects increased by four (4) since the last report.

Mario Cuello asked if the District has considered utilizing wireless BAS (Building Automation System) controls. Jeff Hart said the District has engaged in this practice and is evaluating it further.

Presentation

Facilities Conditions Assessments Update

Basem Ghneim presented an update on the Facilities Conditions Assessment (FCA) and an overview of the Capital Program. He showed the initial plan started in Fiscal Year (FY) 2013, the revisions that were implemented in FY14 to advance Capital Renewal for Group 3 schools, and FY20 update presented to the Board on April 16, 2019, with actuals for projects FY13 thru FY19, plus projected Capital needs FY20 thru FY29.

Further, the presentation compared the Plan vs Performance for FY13-FY19 period for three program elements: the 2003 Sales Tax List, the New Relief Schools and Capital Renewal. Performance for Sales Tax and Relief Schools exceeded expectations due to acceleration of some schools plus the introduction of K-8 schools in lieu of renovating smaller K-5 schools. Performance for the Capital Renewal program was short of expectations due to the planned slow down to accommodate acceleration of Capital projects opening in 2017 and 2018.

A Capital Renewal Fund Tracking slide was presented. The Tracking projected needs for FCA priorities 1-3 and priorities 1-5 against the projected revenue for a period of ten (10) years (FY20-FY29). The presenter pointed out the following:

- Current Sales Tax initiative concludes December 31, 2025, and the final CR fund transfer from Sales Tax 2 is in FY27.
- At the conclusion of the current Sales Tax initiative and if FCA priorities 1-5 were implemented, the expected ending balance is estimated to be \$195 million, but if the program were extended thru the 10-year budget of FY29, the CR needs exceed the available funds.
- At the conclusion of the current Sales Tax initiative and if FCA priorities 1-3 were implemented, the expected ending balance is estimated to be \$435 million, and if extended to FY29, the ending balance is estimated to be \$202 million.
- Based on the projected needs, such balances could be depleted within three (3) years of the end of Sales Tax 2. Therefore, the option to solicit support to extend the Sales Tax initiative must be considered, or other funding sources will be needed.

James Knapp asked about the type of roof the District currently installs. Basem Ghneim explained that currently the District is installing single-ply fully adhered roofs with a life expectancy of 20 years. He stated that the District does have a few older schools with metal roofs that have a higher life expectancy of 35 years.

Mario Cuello asked if there is a tendency to replace HVAC versus refurbish and/or repair. Jeff Hart mentioned that the District does refurbish at times when it is feasible and practicable.

Adjournment

- The committee voted unanimously to cancel the July COVE meeting and to conduct a school bus tour on August 8, 2019 in lieu of the August 15, 2019 COVE meeting.
- The next meeting will be held on Thursday, June 20, 2019, at 8 a.m., at Facilities Services, 6501 Magic Way, Bldg. 200, Orlando, FL 32809.
- As there were no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 9:43 a.m.

Construction Update as of June 11, 2019

We now have 16 projects under construction amounting to approx. \$380M.

5 - Comprehensive = \$90,239,000

- o **Corner Lake MS** (Comprehensive Renovation) NTP was issued on March 9, 2018, and involves four separate phases with an overall substantial completion scheduled for July 26, 2019.
 - The initial phase involving the renovation of the cafeteria/kitchen, gymnasium, band/chorus and play courts/track were completed in August 2018; the second phase involving the renovation of Classroom building 3 was completed on December 14, 2018. Phase 3, renovation of classroom building 2 was recently completed on May 31, 2019. The 4th and last phase, scheduled to be completed July 26, 2019, is currently underway accounting for the renovation of the Administration, Media and Votech buildings, along with the balance of the site related items.
- Lake Gem ES (Comprehensive Renovation) Construction NTP was issued on June 20, 2018, and involves six separate phases including the addition of a twelve classroom building, with an overall substantial completion scheduled for August 1, 2019.
 - The initial phase involving a new Central Energy Plant and a new 12 classroom building was substantially completed on December 20, 2018. The second phase involving the renovation of Classroom Building 5 was substantially completed on February 8, 2019. The third phase involving the renovation of Classroom Building 6 was completed on March 22, 2019. Phase 4 the renovation of Classroom Building 3 was completed on May 1, 2019. And recently commenced with Phase 5 the renovation of Classroom Building 2, is scheduled for completion on July 3, 2019. - Lake George ES (Comprehensive Renovation) Construction NTP was issued on June 20, 2018, and involves five separate phases with an overall substantial completion scheduled for July 26, 2019.
 - The initial phase involving the renovation of Classroom Building 5 was substantially completed on December 14, 2018. The second phase involving the renovation of Classroom Building 3 was substantially completed on February 8, 2019. The third phase involving the renovation of Classroom Building 6 was completed on April 12, 2019. Phase 4 involving the renovation of Classroom Building 2 was just completed on June 10, 2019. The 5th and final phase, the renovation of Admin/Media and Cafeteria buildings is scheduled for completion by July 26, 2019.

- Sunrise ES (Comprehensive/Renovation) Construction NTP was issued on June 20, 2018, and involves five separate phases with an overall substantial completion scheduled for July 26, 2019.
 - The initial phase involving the renovation of Classroom Building 3 was substantially completed on December 14, 2018. The second phase involving the renovation of Classroom Building 5 was substantially completed on February 7, 2019. The third phase involving the renovation of Classroom Building 6 was completed on April 12, 2019. Phase 4 involving the renovation of Classroom Building 2 was just completed on June 11, 2019. The 5th and final phase, the renovation of Admin/Media and Cafeteria buildings is scheduled for completion by July 26, 2019.
- Southwest MS (Comprehensive Renovation) NTP was issued on February 15, 2019, and involves five separate phases with an overall substantial completion scheduled for July 27, 2020.
 - Phase 1 separated into three sub-phases is underway involving the renovation of the
 (1A) chiller yard and replacement of chillers, and (1B) administration, gymnasium,
 cafeteria, and classroom building 900 are scheduled to be substantially completed by
 July 30, 2019, and (1C) classroom building 200 scheduled to be completed by December
 27, 2019.

• Pine Hills Transportation Compound – a construction NTP was issued on September 21, 2017, for this Design-Build transportation project, with an overall project completion scheduled for November 2018. The project schedule milestones account for multiple phases, with the Bus Parking and Staging areas to have been completed by March 8, 2018, the administration building to be substantially complete in August 2018, and the driver's lounge and parking, along with the maintenance building to be substantially completed in November 2018.

Due to unsuitable soils material discoveries, and additional excavation and replacement thereof, the project has experienced extensive time delays and requests for additional compensation, whereby the Design-Builder is now reporting an overall projected substantial completion date of August 30, 2019.

- Initial phase involving the Bus Parking and Staging areas was substantially completed on December 10, 2018, and the Administration Building was completed on January 8, 2019.
- The driver's Lounges and associated parking were completed on February 14, 2019; and are now occupied.

- Based on claims issued by the Design-Builder, additional scope and cost associated with discovered unsuitable soils and debris amount to over \$2M. In addition, additional debris and loose soils have been uncovered at the location for the new fueling island, and are now being addressed.
- Horizon West Middle School (Bridgewater area relief) construction NTP was issued on February 23, 2018, with an overall project substantial completion originally scheduled for May 29, 2019.
 - Due to the delayed start associated with sand skink mitigation measures and gopher tortoise relocations, mobilization for construction was not granted until April 24, 2018, resulting in a 2 month delay. The team worked out an agreement with the CM to mitigate the overall delay to 33 days, with a revised substantial completion date of July 1, 2019.

 - Due to impacts associated with existing underground utilities, and the need for the school to utilize the existing band building over the summer, the demolition of the existing band building and related sitework will not be completed until late August/early September 2019.
- Boone HS Auditorium (Replacement) construction NTP was issued on June 20, 2018, with an overall substantial completion scheduled for June 24, 2019.

- Site 20-E-SW-4 (South I-Drive area relief) construction NTP was issued on May 17, 2019, with an overall substantial completion scheduled for April 10, 2020.
- Pinar ES (Replacement/Renovation) construction NTP is anticipated by June 17, 2019, and the completion of the new main building is scheduled for substantial completion on April 3, 2020; and the subsequent existing building demo and related site amenities are scheduled for completion by October 20, 2020.

Capital Renewal Update – June 20, 2019

There are 53 active projects (22 large, 17 intermediate, 14 small) currently in progress for improvements at 44 sites, with an estimated total cost of \$204.6M and construction cost of \$156.9M. The total number and cost of projects is unchanged since the last report.

There are 12 projects currently being planned, which is a decrease of one since the last report. Planning commenced on a new intermediate digital curriculum project at Pinewood Elementary School. A large campus-wide project at Colonial 9th Grade Center moved to the design phase, and construction commenced on a chiller replacement at Riverdale Elementary School since the last report.

Several projects currently being planned will commence their design phase in the near future. We've concluded scope identification and are currently negotiating design agreements for several projects including the next phase of the Colonial High School project; a heating, ventilating and air conditioning (HVAC) improvements project at Wolf Lake Middle School; and a project addressing combined, similar building envelope and HVAC requirements at Lakeville and Riverdale Elementary Schools. Scope development continues on the remaining projects in planning.

12 projects are currently in the design phase, which is unchanged since the last report. As noted previously, the Colonial 9th Grade Center project commenced design since the last report, while the Castle Creek Elementary School chiller replacement moved to construction. Of the remaining projects in design, several are scheduled to commence construction later this summer. These include projects addressing campus-wide requirements at Ocoee Middle School; building envelope and intercom system issues at Citrus Elementary School; softball field drainage renovations at Boone High School; a roof and rooftop HVAC equipment replacement project at Acceleration East; and a campus-wide project at Jones High School. With the exception of the Ridgewood Park Elementary School paving project, the Bonneville Elementary School HVAC and building envelope project and the Colonial 9th Grade Center campus-wide project which are scheduled for construction commencement in 2020, the remaining projects in design will commence later this year.

29 projects are currently under construction, which is an increase of one since the last report. Projects commencing construction since the last report include small chiller replacements at Riverdale, Castle Creek and Catalina Elementary Schools, and an intermediate chiller replacement at Wekiva High School. Chiller renewal projects at Memorial Middle School and Lake Nona High School were completed since the last report.

The 29 projects under construction include 10 large, 7 intermediate and 12 small projects, with an estimated total cost of \$115.5M and construction cost of \$89.9M. These include three campus-wide high school projects at Boone, Olympia and Timber Creek High Schools that exceed \$10M in construction costs.

Except for the Olympia High School and Gotha Middle School projects which are scheduled for completion early in 2020, all projects currently under construction will be completed later in 2019.

The large and intermediate projects scheduled to commence later in 2019 represent an additional \$27.5M of anticipated construction contract awards for calendar year 2019. The detailed report reflects only minor changes in the forecasted balance of unused capital renewal funds through the end of FY 2020, with \$91.3M available for new requirements.

- Sealant replacement at all tilt wall panel joints
- Wall crack and concrete spalling repairs at building 1100 and the cooling tower yard

Heating, Ventilating and Air Conditioning (HVAC) Renovations

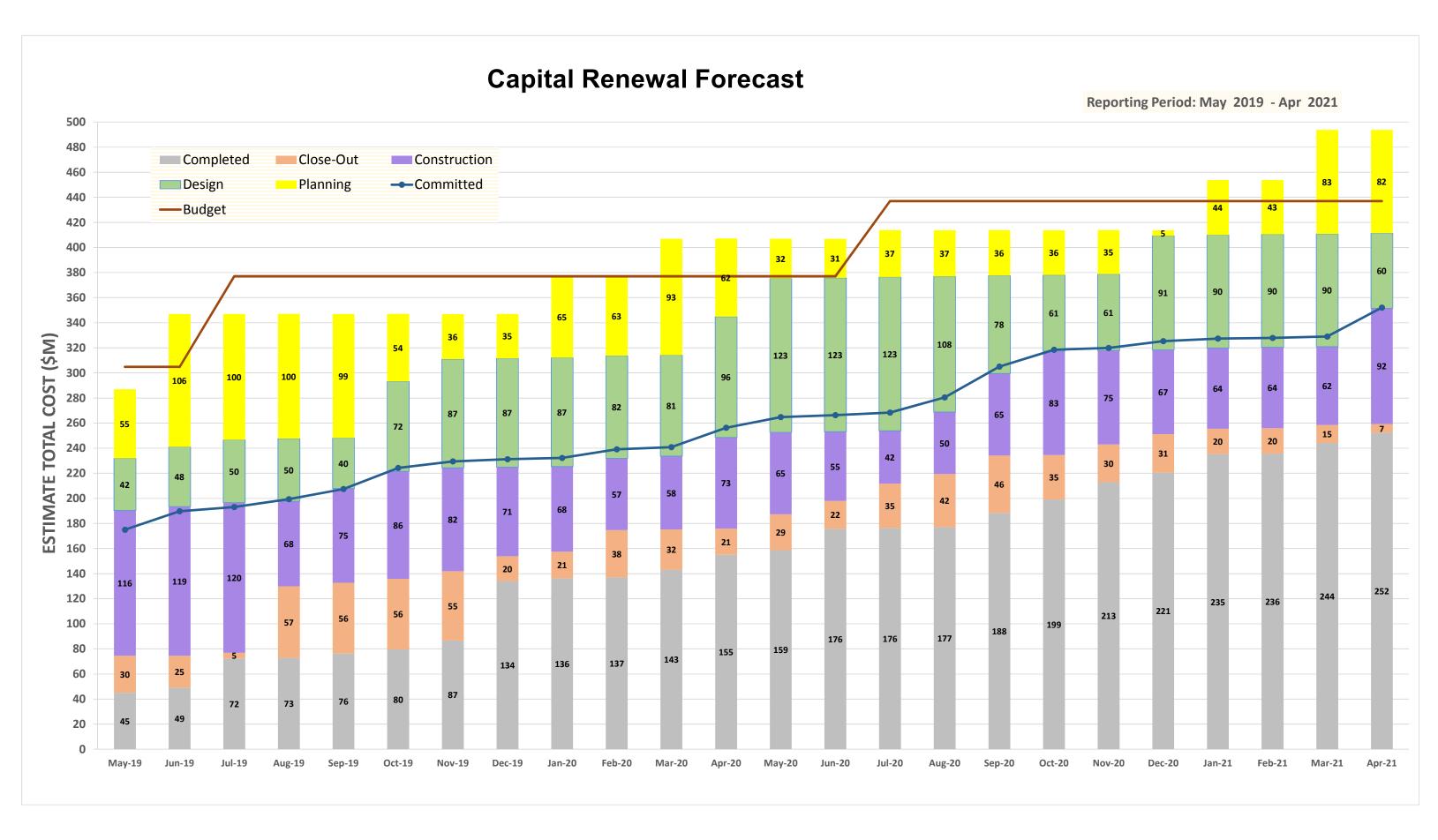
- Replacement of all air-handling units (AHUs), campus-wide (49 AHUs)
- Addition of bi-polar ionization to select AHUs in conjunction with AHU replacement
- Replacement of HVAC duct work within mechanical rooms
- Variable frequency drive (VFD) replacements for AHUs and pumps
- Replacement of heating hot water piping and valves, campus-wide
- Replacement of cooling towers, condenser and chilled water pumps, boilers, condenser water piping and condenser water treatment at the Central Energy Plant (CEP)
- Replacement of the existing building automation system (BAS), campus-wide
- Rebalancing of all HVAC systems

Low-voltage System Improvements

- Replacement of the campus intercom system
- Replacement of the gymnasium sound system

Safety and Security

- Fire alarm system replacement
- Security camera system replacement
- Security camera system expansion (alternate funding)
