WHAT: A groundbreaking for one of two new OCPS high schools opening in 2021

Construction is underway and zoning is about to begin for two new high schools opening in the southwest part of Orange County in 2021. The site currently known as 80-H-SW-4 will provide relief to two overcrowded high schools - Dr. Phillips and Freedom high schools. Both are more than 1,000 students over capacity. This groundbreaking ceremony on the construction site will feature students from both feeder schools, remarks from school district officials and a groundbreaking with golden shovels.
